LAE Tottenham Rated 'Outstanding' by OFSTED

Following a visit in November 2021, LAE Tottenham has been awarded the highest possible grade of "outstanding" in all areas in the school's first ever OFSTED inspection.

The judgements for each area - the quality of education; behaviour and attitudes; personal development and leadership and management were each rated outstanding - the highest grade possible.

The full report which is published on the Ofsted website here, describes how learners are "inspired by their studies", with the school described as having "a studious environment where they are encouraged and challenged to achieve their best academically, and to contribute to the local community."

As well as the "excellent progress" made academically, the report notes the "ambitious and challenging curriculum" which leads to students learning to "conduct themselves with integrity and grow in their understanding of the diverse communities that they live in".

Virtual Speaker from The Department of Clinical Research

A Visit to Oxford & Cambridge

On Tuesday 11th January, 90 Year 12 students visited the universities of Oxford and Cambridge.

The day consisted of a Q&A with current students studying a range of subjects, as well as a tour of colleges. This not only allowed students to have their questions answered by current undergraduates, but it further allowed them to experience what life would be like as prospective students attending these universities.

Mominah from 'St Peters' tutor group commented on her experience saying: "I was fortunate to be one of 45 students who visited Pembroke College in Cambridge - the first in person visit since March 2020. I left feeling very much informed on what my next steps are as a prospective student because I received all the important information about the Cambridge-specific application process, to a 'day in the life' of a Cambridge student.

The main purpose of the trip was to highlight to us the very real possibility of applying and studying at an elite, world-renowned university, which I believe was achieved. It has definitely inspired me to apply to Oxbridge, and help debunk the original stereotypes I had of the 'typical Oxbridge student'."

BBC Finance Workshop

Eight Year 12 students took part in Finance workshops with the BBC, as a part of Maths Season 2021-22 on Thursday 9th December.

Due to the COVID19 restrictions, the sessions were held online, and involved a high-octane combination of media knowledge, financial speculation and group work. Both LAET teams excelled when it came to their media knowledge which is evident that they clearly completed many hundreds of hours of preparatory research on classic BBC theme tunes!

A Conversation About Race

As a part of Year 13's Autumn term "Conversations About Race" programme, we were delighted to welcome Kamal Ahmed to an assembly on Thursday 2nd December. As a journalist who has worked for the Guardian and The Telegraph, as well as a frequent face on BBC News, and latterly recently Editorial Director at BBC News, his views on how the media presents racial issues were fascinating.

He talked about how the profession's relationship with race has changed over the last 30 years. More recently, it has become possible to discuss the issue and solutions more positively, even if at times he was the only black or brown person in the room.

Questions about who decides what is worth covering in the news, as well as concerns about its format, led to Kamal's recent founding of a new News platform ("The News Movement"). He said that the discussions which were taking place at LAET on Tuesdays were the same kind of discussions his team were having. A number of probing questions from students finished the talk, which then led to Kamal's interaction with a group of students who were interested in media careers and questions relating to the Race for a 'working lunch'. He gave the school three copies of his 2018 memoir 'The Life and Times of a Very British Man' and left a lot of inspired students, hopefully some of whom will be deciding the future of the Fourth Estate in the UK in the near future.
